AGM

We had three excellent speakers; Adrian Spalding, Paul Browning and John Chapple with Kathryn Jones. Following the meeting we received confirmation from the Charity Commission to say our application had been approved as a registered charity. The AGM for 2016 will be scheduled for February with confirmation of date.

friendly to others. He hoped his membership will be continued by his daughter Vicky and much treasured granddaughter Seren.

Steve Bassett

Steve was popular among butterfly enthusiasts and was a stalwart supporter of Cornwall's butterflies for many years. He was only 54 years old and leaves a wife, Liz, and two daughters, Natasha & Alexandra.

Carol and Janet have given their services free of charge every year that we have held Open Days at Trelusback and even provided most of the equipment. Their generous help has enabled us to raise substantial amounts of money in previous years for Butterfly Conservation, Cancer Research, Parkinson's disease and this year for Motor Neurone

Disease. Thanks also to all the other members of CBMS who helped including Dave Spencer who kept us in order. My apologies to those I have not mentioned.

The moth night which was held on the previous evening was well attended despite the full moon and clear skies. Traps were provided by Frank Johns, John Foster, Tony and Pat James. Two of our members Steve Ogden and Dave Spencer also ran moth traps at the nearby Stithians Lake to help the South West Lakes Trust with their excellent event which was held on the same day.


Field trips
